Intelligence Narrative No. 134, Day Operation, 19 January 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Currie.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 1050 hours, 36 B-26's took off to bomb Viterbo A/D, Italy. They were escorted by fighters from Coastal Command. None returned early. 18 B-26's were over the target and 16 B-26's dropped 70 x 500 lb demolition bombs 1/10, .025 second delay fuses and 16 x 500 lb demolition bombs (6, 12, and 24 hours delay fuses) on the target at 1312 hours from 9,200'. 65 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .025 second delay fuses) and 24 x 500 lb demolition bombs (6, 12 and 24 hours delay fuses) were dropped in the vicinity of Grotte San Stefano through error of orientation of the leader and most of the first Squadron followed suit. 7 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .025 second delay fuses) having hung were salvoed. 14 x 500 lb demolition bombs (6, 12, and 24 hours delay fuses) were salvoed. 20 x 500 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .025 second delay fuses) were returned to this base, 2 because they hung, and 18 because the bombardiers did not drop, realizing that it was not the proper target. 36 B-26's returned safely to this base at 1458 hours.

C. RESULTS: A good concentration of bombs hit the north and central portions of the A/D, with a direct hit on one of the hangars. 12/15 F/S A/C were seen on the field, of which only 2/3 seemed serviceable.

D. OBSERVATIONS: Air: Air Activity: 1. T/E A/C, unidentified, was seen at 1335 off the coast of Italy, headed east, on deck, from 9,700'.

Situation: 3/4 S/E A/C were seen at Tarquinia A/D at 1330 from 9,700'.

Ground: General: The bridge at Orte was observed to be standing at 1312 from 9,200'. Several small fires were observed in the vicinity of Toriano nel Cimino, 1312 from 9,700'. Communications: 1. 20/25 cars were seen stationary at Orbetello at 1330 from 9,700'.

2. 50/75 cars were seen stationary at Viterbo M/T at 1312 from 9,200'.

3. 10/12 cars were seen stationary at Montalto di Castro at 1318 from 9,700'.

4. 1 train of several cars was seen headed N just north of Orbetello at 1330 from 9,700'.

5. 15/20 cars were seen stationary at Curarurale at 1318 from 9,700'.

6. 6/8 M/T in series of 2 each were seen on the roads in and around Viterbo at 1312 from 9,700'.

7. 2/300 parked trucks were reported/one crew at Vetralla at 1315 from 9,200'.

Flak: 1. From vicinity of Orte at 9,200'.

2. Slight.

3. Heavy.

4. Accurate for altitude, inaccurate for deflection.

5. Continually pointed fire.

6. A five gun heavy battery firing was observed at 42° 43' N, 12° 05' S.

- d. Shipping: One Medium M/V was seen anchored off Lividonia at 1245 from 9,700'.  
One small M/V was seen beached at  $42^{\circ} 18' N$ ,  $11^{\circ} 36' E$ , at 1326 from 9,700'.  
One small M/V moving south was seen off Montalto di Castro at 1326 from 9,700'.  
One small M/V and seven fishing boats were seen anchored off Talamone at 1250 from 9,700'.

3. Losses: None.

4. Weather: Clear over Sardinia. 8-9/10 cumulus topping higher mountains over Corsica. 5-8/10 cumulus, base 5,000', tops 6,000' over open sea, breaking off coast of Italy. Scattered cirrus above 20,000'. Visibility, 8-9 miles in haze. Target: Viterbo Area Open. 3/10 cumulus, base 5,000' tops 6,000' over mountains. Cirrostratus overcast above 20,000' over land. Visibility 8 miles in haze. Return: Cumulus forming over Sardinia.

E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: From this base at 2,500',  $13^{\circ}$  T for 129 statute miles,  $00^{\circ}$  T for 98 statute miles, rendezvous,  $98^{\circ}$  T for 82 statute miles,  $73^{\circ}$  T for 36 statute miles to IP climbing gradually to 9,700'; bomb run # 1 Squadron  $100^{\circ}$  W for 15 statute miles to the vicinity of Grotte San Stefano, bomb run # 2 Squadron  $300^{\circ}$  W for 8 statute miles to the target at 9,200', breakaway right  $248^{\circ}$  T for 16 statute miles;  $215^{\circ}$  T for 259 statute miles descending to 2,500' at this base.
