- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 0950 hours, 27 B-26's of this Group took off to bomb Incisa RR Bridge south, Italy. 3 spares returned early. 24 B-26's were over the target and 22 B-26's dropped 176 x 500 lb. demos (.1 .025 second delay fuses) on the target at 1202 hours and 1214 hours on 2 bomb runs on an axes of 100° M and 274° M. 16 x 500 lb. demo bombs were salvoed in the target area, 8 because of bombardier error and 8 because they hung up. 22 B-26's returned by 1346 hours and 2 B-26's returned by 1430 hours after landing at Chisonaccia, Corsica for fuel.
- C. Results: Two flights of the first squadron did not drop on the first run because of intervelometer failure in the lead a/c. A second run was made at which time theseflights dropped on the target. Both ends of the bridge were covered by good patterns of bombs, scoring hits on the approaches and probable hits on the ends of the structure.
