Intelligence Narrative No. 205, Day Operation, 12 May 1944

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Fletcher.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 13:30 hours, 55 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Troop Concentrations at Fondi, Italy and a Road Defile West of Itri, Italy. 8 B-26's returned early: 4 spares; 1 air speed indicator out; 1 co-pilot sick; 1 frag cluster broke in plane and jammed bomb bay doors; 1 loss of power in both engines. 35 B-26's were over Fondi, and dropped 3,978 x 20# Fragmentation bombs on the target at 15:18 hours from 9,600' to 11,300' on axes of 360°T, 11°T, and 20°T. 12 B-26's were over Road Defile West of Itri and dropped 48 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .025) on the target at 15:16 hours from 12,100' to 11,500' on an axis of 45°T. 150 x 20# Fragmentation bombs were salvaged in the target area, having hung up. 60 x 20# Fragmentation bombs were returned to base, having hung up. 40 B-26's returned to base at 16:57 hours. 6 B-26's returned late between 18:35 hours and 19:02 hours, after landing at Naples, 5 having escorted damaged aircraft there and 1 with 2 injured crew members. 1 B-26 is at Naples because of flak damage.

C. Results: Fondi Troop Concentrations:

Bombs of two Squadrons started in Southwest portion of the target and walked to the hills beyond. Bombs of the 3rd Squadron covered the Eastern portion of the target area.

Road Defile West of Itri:

The target was missed. All bombs landed about 700 yards East of the target.

D. Observations:

1. Air: None.

2. Ground:

a. General: None.

b. Communications:

- (1) 10 RR cars at G-1326 were seen at 15:16 hours from 10,000'.
- (2) 10 RR cars were seen at G-3314 at 15:17 hours from 10,000'.
- (3) 15 M/T parked at G-3103 were seen at 15:16 hours from 10,000'.
- (4) 15/20 M/T headed West at G-3021 were seen at 15:15 hours

from 10,000'.

c. Flak: From landfall to the target, moderate heavy, accurate for altitude, fairly accurate for deflection, continuously pointed fire, was encountered. 2 heavy guns were seen firing at G-4500, and 2-4 gun batteries on North edge of Fondi were seen firing.

3. Losses: None; damaged, 17 B-26's by flak (only 2 had more than a few minor holes); 3 crew members wounded.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: Clear.
- b. Target: 4/10ths cumulus at 8,000'.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From base at 2,500' to 2 miles West of Ventotene Island; to 41° 09' N / 13° 22' E, climbing gradually to 10,500'; bomb runs: 360°T, 11°T, and 20°T to target (Fondi); 45°T to Road Defiles; breakaway left to coast North of Sabaudia; direct to base.
