## Intelligence Narrative No. 242, Day Operation, 8 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Colonel Macia.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 0943 hours, 13 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Terentola M/Y, Italy (M/R: R380044, sheet 122). The target was obscured by clouds, and Cecina Rd. Bridge, last resort target was bombed instead. 12 B-26's were over the targets, and 6 dropped 48 x 500 lb demolition bombs (42 1/10, .01 second delay fuses) 3 6 hour delay; 3 24 hour delay fuses: on the target at 1206 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on an axis of 230° T. 40 x 500 lb demolition bombs were salvoed over land; 8 because A/C was damaged by flak; 32 because of accidental release by a flight leader in the primary target area. 8 x 500 lb demolition bombs were salvoed in the water, having hung up over the target. 1/B-26's returned to base at 1333 hours and 1 B-26'is in Corsica with pilot injured by flak.
- C. RESULTS: Cecina hd. Bridge was covered with a good pattern of bombs, scoring directs hits on its site. Bridge was more than half destroyed prior to bombing.

b. Communications: See Marrative No. 241, this date.

c. Flak: From Terentols moderate heavy accurate for both altitude and deflection was encountered on bomb run (axis 59°) as bombay doors opened and following on breakaway. 25 bursts of heavy inaccurate flak was encountered from Cortons. Continuously pointed fire.

Positions: 3 heavy guns among 3 bldgs just east of M/Y at Cortona.

- 3. Losses: None; damaged by flak, 10; 1 crew member injured.
- 4. Weather: See Warrative No. 241, this date.
- E. ROUTES AND ALTITUDES: Same as Marrative No. 241, except only one bomb run was made on the primary target.
