Intelligence Narrative No. 247, Day Operation, 10 June 1944.

A. Flight Commander: Lt. Deatly.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 1550 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Bucine Viaduct W (M/R RO59375, sheet 114). 2 B-26's returned early, 1 spare and 1 ill crew member. 18 B-26's were over the target at 1750 hours and 10,000' but no bombs were dropped due to cloud cover. All bombs were returned to base. 18 B-26's returned to base at 1937 hours.
