Intelligence Narrative No. 247. Day Operation, 12 Jun: 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Colonel Macia.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0855 hours, 14 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Foggibonsi Viaduct, Italy (M/R: 717310, sheet 113). 3 B-26's returned early: 2 spares, 1 wrong type chute for harness. 11 B-26's were over the target and 10 dropped 40 x 1000 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 1049 hours from 9,100' to 8,900' on an axis of 292° I. 4 x 1000 lb demolition bombs were returned to base, having hung over the target. 11 B-26's returned to base at 1216 hours.

C. RESULTS: The target was missed. The bombs landed in a good pattern short to the east of the target.

D. OBSERVATIONS:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity: Spitfires, escorting were seen engaging A/A, 10,000' above the formation.

b. Situation: 1. New landing strip, no A/C, 2 miles north of Montepescali.

2. Siena Malignano and Grosseto A/C's empty.

2. Ground:

a. General: 1. Large explosion at 87679 at 1026 hours.
2. Probable supply dump at 85990.

b. Communications:

1. 100 RR cars between 84987 and 86078.

2. 20 RR cars at 8714.

3. Minor A/T movement going north over route.

c. Elak: None.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather: Enroute: Over water, generally clear.
Target: 5/10 cumulus, 5-8,000' over Italy.
Return: As enroute.

5. ROUTE AND ALTITUDES: From 2,500' at base to Castiglione di. Pescaia; to Rapoleno; to target; breakway left to Castiglione d. Pescaia; reciprocal course to base.
