Intelligence Narrative No. 248, Day Operation, 12 June 1944

Flight Commander: Captain Shuh.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:25 hours, 19 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge East of Perugia (M/R: W-734922, sheet 122), Italy. 1 spare returned early. 18 B-26's were over the target and dropped 72 x 1,000# demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 11:37 hours from 11,000' to 10,500' on an axis of 115°T. 18 B-26's returned to base at 13:10 hours.

C. Results: The bridge was covered with an excellent pattern of bombs scoring probable direct hits.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) 1 S/E silver colored a/e with pontoons, flying slowly East toward Elba at 11:14 hours.
- (2) 1 FW-190 to right and low followed formation from L. Bolsena to the target.

b. Situation:

Perugia A/D empty, but appeared serviceable; Grosseto appeared serviceable, but empty.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) Red light flashes at B-4474 and B-8260.
- (2) Hospital at A-0272.
- (3) Road bridge out at W-3983.

b. Communications:

- (1) 100 RR cars at B-6078 to B-6552.
- (2) 40 RR cars at B-7885.
- (3) 140 RR cars at B-3509 to A-3482.
- (4) At Perugia, 60 RR cars.
- (5) 1 train of 20 RR cars moving South-East at W-6623, at 11:37 hours.
- (6) 6 horse-drawn vehicles at W-1165 at 11:45 hours.
- (7) 10/20 M/T moving North at A-1351 at 11:34 hours.
- (8) Minor roads North of Lake Trasimano, 40 M/T moving South at

11:43 hours.

c. Flak: None encountered but shooting at other formations, the following was seen:

From Cortona at 12 B-26's of another Group about 200 bursts of heavy flak.
From South of Orvieto, scant heavy flak.
Along road from Arezzo to Siena, moderate heavy flak.

d. Shipping:

2 barges off mouth of Ombrone river.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

a. Enroute: Generally clear over water.

b. Target: Open; 6/10ths cumulus, 5-8,000' in area.

c. Return: As Enroute.

E. Routes and Altitudes: From 2,500' at base, to landfall at mouth of Ombrone river; to I.P., Castiglion del Lago climbing to 12,000'; to target at 11,000'; to Castiglion del Lago; to base.

F. Comments: None.
