16 June 1944.

- A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).
- B. At 0430 hours, 1 B-26 took off from Serragia A/D, Corsica on a Photo Reconnaissance. Cloud cover prevented the taking of more than a few photographs. 1 B-26 returned to Serragia at 0630 hours.
- C. RESULTS: Photographs were taken of Roccastrada and two unidentified bridges.
