Intelligence Narrative No. 262. Day Operation, 21 June 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Probesco.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 0845 hours, 30 B-26's took off to bomb the RR Viaduct (M/H 0-995765, sheet 82), Italy. 3 B-26's returned early, which were spares. 27 B-26's were over the target and 17 B-26's dropped 68 x 1000 lb demolition bombs (1/10, .01 second delay fuses) in two runs, (36 on first, 32 on second), on the target at 1102 hours from 10,500' to 10,000' on an axis of 220°. 40 x 1000 lb demolition bombs were returned to base, 36 because the squadron carrying them were not in position to drop on the target; 4 because of bomb bay door malfunction in A/C carrying them. 27 B-26's returned to base at 1249 hours.

C. RESULTS: The target was covered with an excellent concentration of bombs, scoring several direct hits. Photographic coverage confirms the destruction of at least two spans. Bombs of one squadron landed on the road and bridge just north of the target.

d. Shipping: 1. 4 W/V at 0-6140 at 1042 hours.

2. 2 W/V and 4 landing craft 0-6843 at 1043 hrs.
3. 2 large W/V, 6 small W/V, 1 flat topped ship at Genoa at 1116 hours.
4. 1 small W/V, 6 barges, 15 small craft at F-1938 at 1118 hours.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: 9 to flak; 1 man injured.

4. Weather: a. Enroute: Broken stratus decks at 10,000' and 12,000'; scattered clouds below.

4. Weather (Cont'd.)

- b. Target: 3-4/10 cumulus, 4-5⁰000'.
- c. Return: As enroute.

E. ROUTE: Base to rendezvous at Alto; to landfall at Voltri; to Massone; to Rossiglione; to target (two squadrons, 180° curve to left and second bomb run); to land exit at Camogli (one squadron which encountered moderate flak, land exit at Voltri); to base.
