Intelligence Narrative No. 319, Day Operation, 17 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Lt. Col. Macia.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 08:50 hours, 30 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Montpellier Railroad Bridge (M/R; (B) S-260486, CGCS 4249, sheet 12Q), France. 3 B-26's returned early: 1 spare; 1 generator out; 1 oil leak. 27 B-26's were over the target. 17 B-26's dropped 68 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 11:23 hours from 10,000' on an Axis of 145°T. 9 B-26's dropped 36 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) 1½ miles North-West of the target due to bombardier error (bombardier did not know that his extended vision was on). 4 x 1,000# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) were returned to base, not having been dropped due to bombardier error. 27 B-26's returned to base at 13:18 hours.

C. Results: Target was missed. Bombs of one Squadron hit on the river bank South-West of the target, and another Squadron hit the East approaches of the bridge.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: P-47's and escort provided area cover.
- b. Situation: Montpellier A/D empty and unserviceable at 11:23 hours.

2. Ground:

a. General:

- (1) 6 coastal guns in emplacements in two rows of 3 each at Stee. Marie De La Mer.
- (2) 2 coastal guns 4 miles south of Le Grau De Roi.

b. Communications:

- (1) Train of 75 RR cars moving North at Boissenon at 11:08 hours.
- (2) 15/20 RR cars at Somniers.
- (3) 2 trains of 4/5 RR cars each moving South-West at Vergeze at 11:07 hours.
- (4) 20 RR cars at Uehard.
- (5) 300 RR cars, several locomotives, stationary, at Lunel at 11:07 hours.
- (6) Train 12 RR cars headed East from Lunel at 11:06 hours.
- (7) Train of 50/75 RR cars headed South-West, South-West of Lunel at 11:25 hours.
- (8) 150 RR cars at St. Laurent D'Aigouze.
- (9) 25 RR cars, train of 50 RR cars approaching town from North-East, at Le Grau Du Roi at 11:31 hours.

- (10) 8 M/T headed, West, West of Lunel at 11:26 hours.
- (11) 12 M/T headed North-East toward Nimes from Lunel at 11:26 hours.
- (12) 25 M/T headed East into St. Gilles at 11:07 hours.
- (13) 6 M/T working, other construction activity at mouth of Petit

Rhone River.

c. Flak: None.

d. Shipping:

(1) 5/6 barges at Le Grau Du Roi at 11:35 hours.

(2) 2 barges, 1 beached M/V at the mouth of the Petit Rhone River, at 11:35 hours.

(3) 6 barges at the mouth of Rhone River.

(4) 1 large M/V, stationary, off I. Rion.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

a. Enroute: Scattered cumulus at 5,000'.

b. Target: High cirrus above; open but hazy below.

c. Return: As enroute.

E. Routes: Base to landfall at mouth of Petit Rhone River; to St. Hippolyte; to IP, St. Martin De-Londres; to target; breakaway left to Lunel; to mouth of Petit Rhone River; to base.

F. Comments: None.
