Intelligence Narrative No. 220, Day Operation, 21 August 1944.

Flight Commander: Captain Smith.

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 09:22 hours, 20 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb the Road Bridge at Borgo San Lorenzo (M/R: (N) Q-909879, CSOS 4164, sheet 106), Italy. 2 B-26's returned early: spares. 18 B-26's were over the target and 18 B-26's dropped 144 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 10:19 hours from 9,000' to 8,500' on an Axis of 269° T. 18 B-26's returned to base at 12:09 hours.

C. Results: The bombs of one Squadron covered the bridge with an excellent pattern of bombs, scoring 3 to 4 direct hits and probably destroying it. The bombs of one squadron landed just over to the west.

D. Observations:

1. Air:

- a. Air Activity: P-47's and spitfires provided area cover.
- b. Situations: None.

2. Ground:

a. General:

(1) Large black object, possibly parked trucks, along East side of road just south of Barberino di Mugello.

(2) Fire and white smoke at Palazzolo.

(3) Supply dump 3 miles North-East of Murradi.

(4) Camouflaged two-story building at Predappio Nuova.

b. Communications:

(1) 30 MM cars at S. Pietro A Sieve.

(2) 25/30 MM cars between Borgo San Lorenzo and Vicchio.

(3) 6/10 MM cars in first M/T's North of Borgo San Lorenzo.

(4) 2 M/T's with trailers moving South, 4 miles North of Borgo San Lorenzo at 10:19 hours.

(5) 3/4 M/T's, stationary, 3 miles south of Civitella di Romagna at 10:14 hours.

(6) 6 M/T's headed West, 10 miles east of Pontassieve at 09:50 hours.  
c. Marks: None encountered. From vicinity of Vigilia, Moderate. Heavy. was seen being fired at another B-26 formation at 10:19 hours.

d. Shipping: None.

3. Losses: None. Damaged: None.

4. Weather:

- a. Enroute: CAVU.
- b. Target: CAVU.
- c. Returns: CAVU.

E. Routes: Base to landfall at mouth of Ombrone River; to Montevarchi; to Portico Di Romagna; 180° curve North of Margato Saraceno; to I.P., Civitella Di Romagna; bomb run to target; breakaway right to Portico Di Romagna; reciprocal course to base.

F. Comments: None.
