Intelligence Narrative No. 367. Day Operation. 3 Oct., 1944

A. 320th Bombardment Group (M).

B. At 13:08 hours, 9 B-26's of the 320th Bombardment Group (M) took off to bomb Neversa Causeway, North End (N/R: (R) G-644932, GCS 4164, Sheet 51), Italy. No B-26's returned early. 9 B-26's were over the target and 9 B-26's dropped 54 x 500# RHE Bombs and 18 x 500# Demolition bombs (1/10 & .01 second delay fuses) on the target at 15:09 hours from 9,400' to 8,900' on an Axis of 125°T. 9 B-26's returned to base at 16:47 hours.

C. Results: A good pattern of bombs covered the North end and approaches of the target, scoring possible direct hits on both.
