HEAVY AA GUNS EAST OF CASSANO DI ADDA RR BRIDGE (M/R) (C) K-329685, USGS 4164,
Sheet 46, Italy.

At 1415 hours 3 B-26's took off. No B-26's returned early. No B-26's lost over or prior to target. 3 B-26's were over the target. 3 B-26's dropped 360 x 20 lb frag bombs on the primary target at 1551 hours from 9,100' on an axis of 14° T. No bombs were salvaged. No bombs were returned to base. 3 B-26's returned to base at 1649 hours. No B-26's lost. No B-26's missing. No B-26's slightly damaged or otherwise.

RESULTS: Bombs covered an area just south west of the guns positions, with a few possibly walking into the north-west edge of the area.

ENEMY AIR OPPOSITION: None.

FLAK: S-M, H, I I GP type flak was encountered from the target. Commenced just before bomb run, and continued for 30 seconds into breakaway.

ROUTE: Identical with Report No. 391 except axis was 14° T.

WEATHER: a. See Report No. 391, this date.

AIR OBSERVATIONS: None.

NAVAL OBSERVATIONS: None.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS: See Report No. 391, this date.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: 3 Boxes of Chaff were dropped between IP and target by these A/C.
