GUN POSITIONS NORTH OF CASALE MONFERRATO (A/R # 1) J-627324, GUNS 4164, CASET 57).
Italy.

At 12:01 hours, 3 B-26's took off. 10 B-26's returned early. 10 B-26's lost prior to target. 3 B-26's were over the target. 10 bombs were dropped because a/c were not on proper axis of attack. 3 B-26's were over the target. Primary, at 13:15 hours at 10,200' on an Axis of 244°T. 120 x 20-lb. Fragmentation bombs were salvoed over water. 240 x 20-lb. Fragmentation bombs were returned to base. 3 B-26's returned to base at 14:23 hours. 10 B-26's lost or missing. 2 B-26's slightly damaged by flak. No B-26's seriously damaged.

RESULTS: None.

ANONY FLIGHTS OR OTHERS: None.

FLAK: M. H. A. A. CW type flak encountered from target. Commenced 2 minutes before bombs away, and stopped on breakaway.

ROUTE: Base to Moneglia, I-4020; to Borgo Priolo, I-1809; to Carlasco, I-0256; to LF, Mortara, I-8742; to target on an Axis of 244°T; breakaway left to Mortara, I-8742; reciprocal course to base.

REASONS: See Report No. 405, this date.

AIR DEFENSE FIRES: None.

HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS: None.

OPPOSITIVE OBSERVATIONS: See Report No. 4, this date.

SPCIAL COMMENTS: This was the second flight of 5 a/c assigned to frag gun positions and drop chaff in advance of an 18 a/c formation bombing Casale Monferrato RR bridge. 12 boxes of chaff were dropped between Mortara and the target.
