320th Bombardment Group (M).

20 B-26's took off at 1152 hours to bomb Kaiserlautern stores and workshops M/R: R-042937, CGCS 4426, sheet U-2. 1 B-26 returned early, which was a spare. 19 B-26's were over the primary target and no B-26's dropped due to weather, but were over the target at 1434 hours from 10,600' on an axis of 350° true. No bombs were salvaged and all bombs were returned to base. No B-26's were lost and no B-26's are missing. 4 B-26's slightly damaged by flak. 19 B-26's returned to base at 1559 hours.
