MUNNSCHWILER SUPPLY DUMP, M/R: (4) 842686, GRS 4416, sheet V-2.

320th Bombardment Group (M).

24 B-26's took off at 1040 hours to bomb Munnschwiler supply dump, Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total sorties: 9. 24 B-26's were over the target and 9 B-26's dropped 260 x 100 lb GP bombs (inst. .025 second delay fuses) on the primary target at 1245 hours from 12,000' on an axis of 275 degrees true. 10 x 100 lb bombs having hung up were salvoed in the target area. No bombs were returned to this base. The target was not identified by the other A/C and they dropped on Gas Barracks at (N) R-336206. No B-26's were lost and no B-26's are missing. No B-26's slightly damaged by flak: 9 B-26's returned to base at 1404 hours.

NUNSCHEILER SUPPLY DUMP, M/R: (4) 842686, SOS 4416, Sheet V-2.

320th Bombardment Group (M).

24 B-26's took off at 1040 hours to bomb Nunschewiler supply dump, Germany. No B-26's returned early. Total sorties: 15. 24 B-26's were over the target but it was not identified by 2 squadrons of 15 A/C, but 15 A/C dropped 414 x 100 GP bombs (inst. .025 second delay fuses) on the alternate target, SOS Barracks M/R: (4) R-336206. At 1315 hours at 11,000' on an axis of 86° true. 36 x 100 lb bombs having hung up were salvoed in the target area. No bombs were returned to this base. No B-26's were lost and no B-26's are missing. No B-26's damaged. 15 B-26's returned to base at 1404 hours.
