NEUSTADT M/Y, (M/R: (W) R-302835, GSGS 4416, sheet U-2), Germany.
Alternate: BUNDENTHAL M/Y (M/R: (W) R-052560, GSGS 4416, sheet Y-2), Germany.

320th Bombardment Group (M).

At 12:00 hours, 48 B-26's took off to bomb Neustadt M/Y (M/R: (W) R-302835, GSGS 4416, sheet U-2), Germany. 5 B-26's returned early: Engines cutting out. Total sorties: 43. No B-26's were over the Primary target, because of cloud cover and the Alternate target Bundenthal M/Y (M/R: (W) R-052560, GSGS 4416, sheet Y-2), Germany was bombed instead, on "ETA". 43 B-26's were over the Alternate target and 43 B-26's dropped 341 x 500 lb. Demolition bombs (.1 & .025 second delay fuses) at 14:20 hours from 12,600' to 11,200' on an axis of 15°T, (Briefed axis 13°T; drift correction from IP, plus .04°; evasive action at IP; loss of altitude). 3 x 500 lb. Demolition bombs were salvoed at 15:21 hours at (W) R-0673, having hung up over the target. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 43 B-26's returned to base at 15:15 hours.

AIR OBSERVATIONS:

a. Air Activity:

- (1) F-47's provided escort.
- (2) 2 S/E U/I A/C, black in color, reported strafing and drawing light AA fire, south of saverns at (W) Q-7310 at 14:32 hours.

b. Situation: None.

ENEMY AIR ENCOUNTERS: None.

CLAIMED E/A: None.

FLAK: S, H, I, I, - 8 to 10 bursts type flak encountered from south-west of Reichshoffen, at (W) Q-9031. No B-26's lost or damaged by flak.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS:

a. General:

- (1) White long vertical column of fire, mushrooming out to a large white hanging cloud, 2,000 yards East of the formation as it broke from the target, at (W) R-0058 at 14:21 hours, believed to be a rocket.
- (2) 30 buildings in wooded area, possibly barracks or warehouses at Woerth (W) R-0138 at 14:17 hours.

GROUND OBSERVATIONS: (Cont'd)

b. communications:

50/80 M/T headed south at Reichshoffen, (W) C-9537, radioed in, also scattered traffic between Reichshoffen and the Alternate target, at 14:17 hours.

CASUALTIES: None.

ROUTE: Base to rendezvous at Luneville (W) C-0800; to Sarrebourg (W) C-5016; to Saverne (W) C-7316; to Reichshoffen (W) R-9537; to IP for Primary target, Wilgartswiesen (W) R-1168; to (W) R-1864; curve left to Saverne; to IP for Alternate target, Woerth (W) R-1874; to Alternate target on an axis of 150°T; breakaway left to Saverne (W) C-7316; reciprocal course to base.

WEATHER:

- a. enroute: clear, moderate haze.
- b. target vicinity:
- c. Target Area : stratocumulus overcast, top estimated 6,000', extended North and East from Woerth, covering both Primary and Alternate targets.
- d. Return: same as enroute.

RESULTS: Bombs were dropped on "ETA"; no results observed due to cloud cover.

SPECIAL COMMENTS: One of the early returns salvaged 8 x 500 lb. Demolition bombs in an open field at (W) C-0759 just after take-off, due to engine trouble. The bombs were salvaged safe, and did not explode.
