BAD MÜNSTER RAILROAD BRIDGE (E/A: (W) M-083351, GSGB 4416, sheet T-2), Germany.

At 11:34 hours, 20 B-26's took off to bomb Bad Munster Railroad Bridge (E/A: (W) M-083351, GSGB 4416, sheet T-2), Germany. 2 B-26's returned early: 2 engineering. Total sorties: 18. 18 B-26's were over the Primary target and 18 B-26's dropped 72 x 1,000# Demolition Bombs (.1 & .01 second delay fuses, at 13:24 hours from 11,200' to 10,800' on an Axis of 304°T, by the "BAT" method. No bombs were salvoed or returned to base. No B-26's lost or missing. No B-26's damaged. 18 B-26's returned to base at 14:42 hours.

ROUTE: Base to Dole; to Luneville, rendezvous; to Sarrebourg; to Wingen M-7236; to Steinbach M-9648; to Wilgartsweisen M-1168; to rail junction 2 miles west of Lambrecht M-2387; to Grunstadt, OP, M-3108; to 3 miles south of Alzey, IP, M-2724 (briefed axis over IP - 302°T; drift correction over IP - 08° to the left; evasive action used - loss of altitude); to target; left break to Hochstatten M-0830; to Alzey 2728; to Wilgartsweisen; to Sarrebourg; to Spinal; to base.

WEATHER:

- a. enroute : Broken stratus at take-off, bases 4,000', tops 6,000', becoming overcast just north of Dijon, and tops rising to 10,000' at Luneville and to the North.
- b. Vicinity of Target : 10/10ths stratocumulus, tops 10,000'.
- c. Target Area : 10/10ths stratocumulus, tops 10,000'.
- d. Return : Same as enroute.

RESULTS: No results observed - bombed through overcast.
